



This reconstruction of a 1628 shallop sailed on Merrymeeting Bay last summer and again this August. ELIZABETH TILLEY added a decidedly 17th century look to the Kennebec when members of the John Howland Society recreated the voyage of the Pilgrims to commemorate the establishment of a trading post at Augusta by their ancestor.

TILLEY spent the winter in Maine and this August is returning to Plimoth Colony after twice having been welcomed at Popham Beach by members of Maine's First Ship.

Virginia will be about 20 feet longer than this.
